| INPATIENT SETTING | <i>Registered Nurses who work in a hospital or inpatient setting, including those caring for patients in specialty long term acute care hospitals, skilled nursing facilities, and acute rehabilitation long term care facilities.</i> |
| OUTPATIENT SETTING <i>Presented by Cigna</i> | <i>Registered Nurses who work in outpatient settings, including hospice/palliative care, home-health, public health, clinics, K-12 schools/universities, transplant coordinators, parishes, prisons, case management and those working in telemedicine.</i> |
| EDUCATION <i>Presented by Chamberlain College of Nursing</i> | <i>Registered Nurses who are educating future nurses, or those advancing their careers by obtaining higher education through university/college, hospital & community college/other school setting. Includes nurses providing education within a hospital and/or community setting, including schools; includes nurses who have made contributions that have advanced either research or the nursing professions.</i> |
| FRIEND OF NURSING (NON-NURSE) | <i>Person/professional who works closely with nurses & who supports the professional nurse in providing comprehensive nursing care to the patient & their family. Their collaboration with nurses improves the outcome/experience of the patient & their family. Includes individuals working in non-direct care roles, including IT, informatics, infection control & occupational health, quality & risk management, nursing expert witnesses, and others who work closely with nurses to complement direct nursing care. No nursing degree is required to be eligible for this category.</i> |
| NURSING LEADERSHIP & ADMINISTRATION MANAGEMENT <i>Presented by Grand Canyon University College of Nursing/Healthcare Professions</i> | <i>Registered Nurses who have demonstrated exceptional leadership in nursing or patient care. May include entrepreneurs, consultants, CNE's, CNO's, VP's and Administrative Directors; also those with supervisory roles in a clinical or non-clinical setting, including Charge Nurses; full-time, shift/clinical coordinators and Department Directors or Managers.</i> |
| PEDIATRIC <i>Presented by Phoenix Children's Hospital</i> | <i>Registered Nurses in nursery, general pediatric units, pediatrics clinics and private practice nursing, oncology settings, PICU & NICU.</i> |
| STUDENT NURSE <i>Presented by University of Phoenix</i> | <i>Students enrolled in pre-licensure education either a BSN or an ADN, with a minimum GPA of 3.25, who has assumed a leadership role in a nursing student organization as well as exemplified outstanding participation within the community.</i> |
| WOMEN'S HEALTH <i>Presented by Springer Publications</i> | <i>Registered Nurses involved in Antepartum, Labor and Delivery, Maternal/Baby Care, Postpartum & Gynecology. Includes Certified Nurse Midwives and Nurse Psychotherapists involved with postpartum mental health.</i> |
