



Black women are 3 times more likely than White women to die from pregnancy-related causes nationwide. March of Dimes is taking bold actions to address this issue through training programs for health care providers and by working closely with state and federal lawmakers and agencies to find solutions to the nation's crisis around health equity.

WE'RE NOT THERE YET

March of Dimes has made great strides in improving the health of families, but despite our best efforts our nation is in the midst of a maternal and infant health crisis, and the need continues to increase as a result of COVID-19. This is particularly devastating for underserved communities and families of color. Data shows that the U.S. remains among the most dangerous developed nations for childbirth. More than 700 women die each year from pregnancy-related causes, and the CDC reports that 60 percent of these deaths are preventable.
